

HAPPY FATHER'S DAY:

A most joyful Father's Day to all our fathers and especially to our Most Holy Father:

The Golden Arrow:

May the Most Holy, Most Adorable, Most Incomprehensible and Unutterable Name of God be always praised, blessed, loved, adored and glorified, in heaven, on earth and by the Sacred Heart of our Lord Jesus Christ, in the Most Holy Sacrement of the Altar. Amen.

Matthew 5:33-37 discusses the importance of truthfulness and integrity in a believer's life. Jesus is condemning the practice of swearing oaths, especially those used dishonestly or frivolously, and instead encourages his followers to be known for their honest and straightforward speech. The verses teach that a believer's word should be reliable and trustworthy, so that there is no need to add oaths to emphasize their promises.

Elaboration:

The Problem with Swearing:

Jesus points out that using oaths, especially oaths that are not sincere or are used to lie, is a way to make claims that are not based on truth.

The Alternative: Trustworthy Speech:

Instead of relying on oaths, Jesus calls his followers to be known for their honesty and trustworthiness. Their "yes" should be "yes" and their "no" should be "no," without the need for additional emphasis or oaths to prove their word.

Context of the Sermon on the Mount:

This teaching is part of Jesus' broader message in the Sermon on the Mount, where he is calling his followers to a higher standard of righteousness that goes beyond the superficial practices of some religious groups.

Application:

Jesus' message in Matthew 5:33-37 is not just about avoiding oaths. It is a call to a more authentic and truthful way of living, where a believer's character and behavior reflect the truth of their faith.
